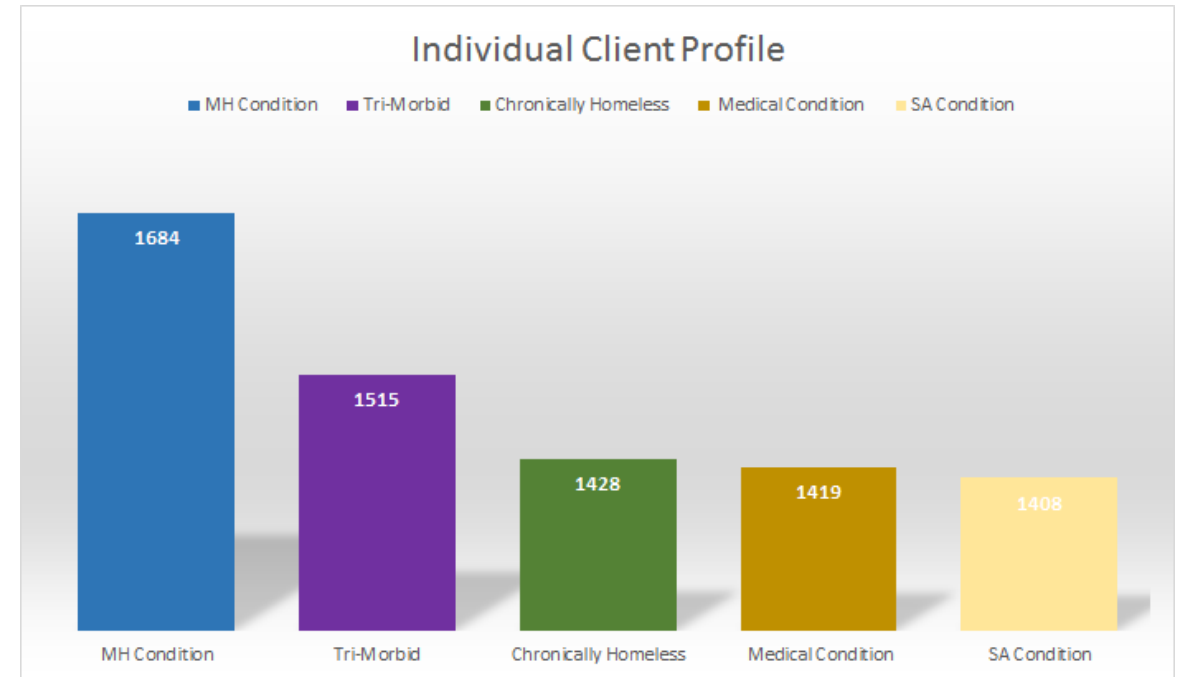
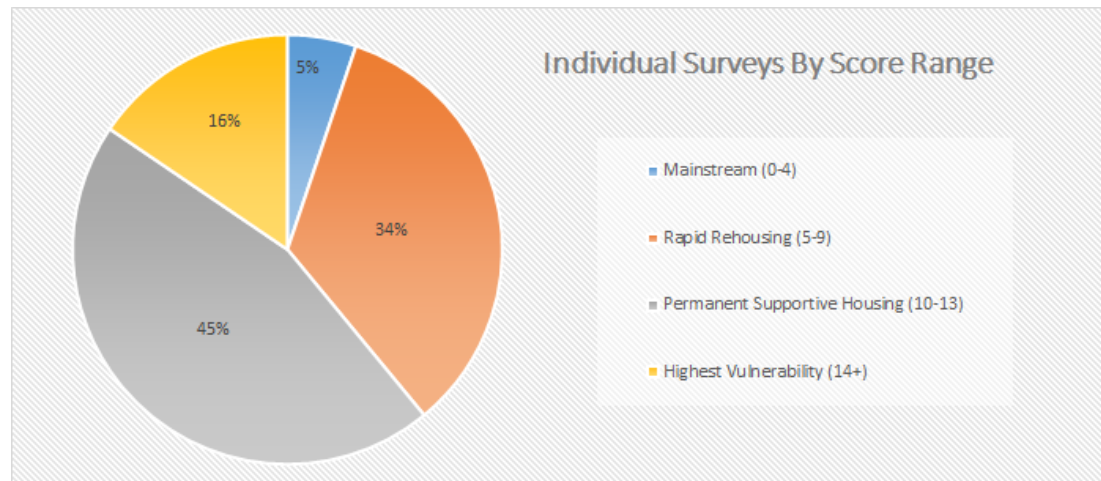
Updates

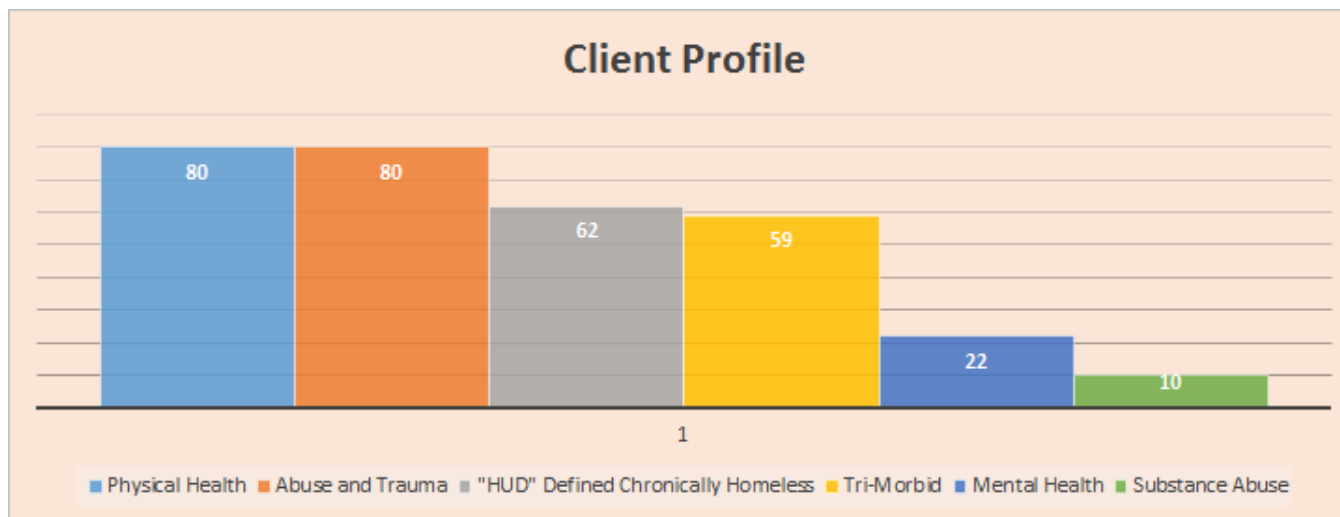
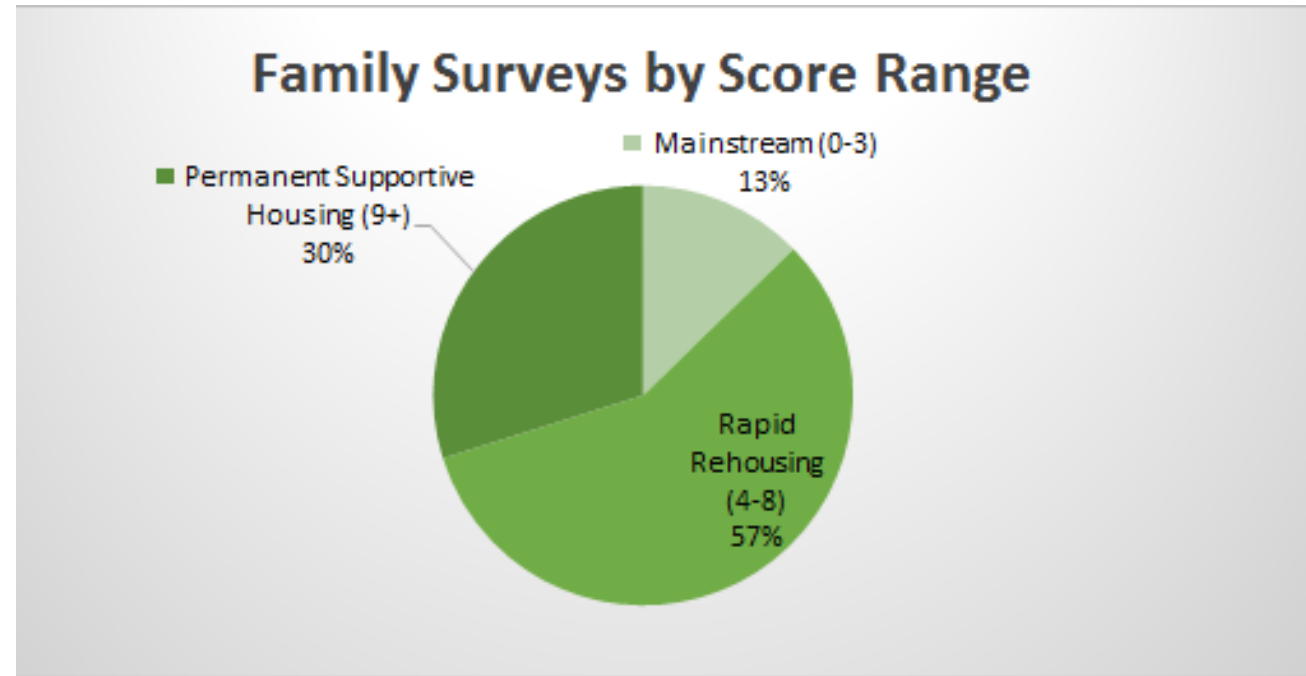
Individuals Update (Data 2016-present)

- 180+ Surveys

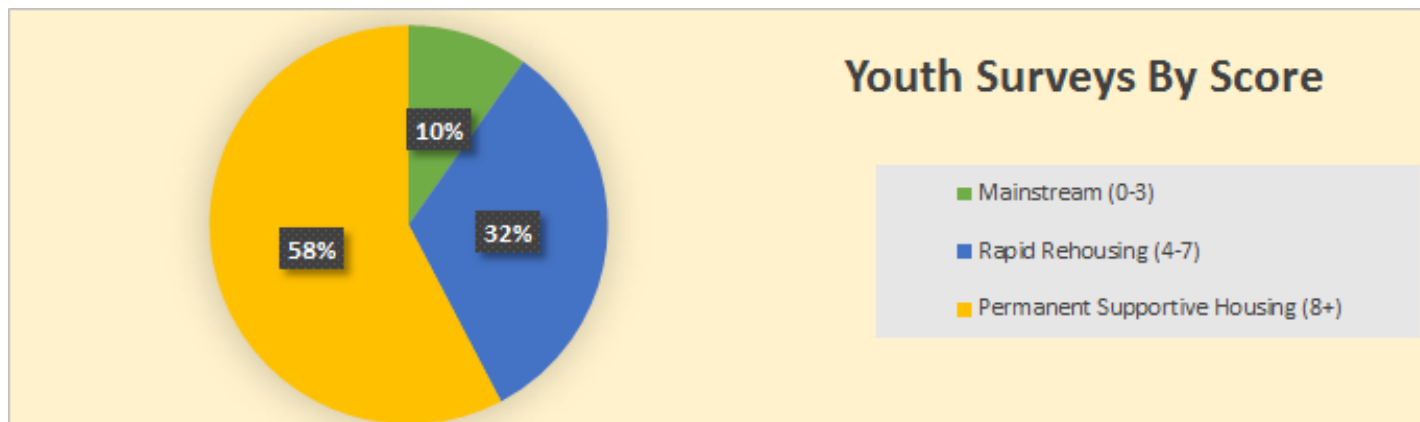


Youth Update

Community Provider Feedback & Progress

- VI-SPDAT Script: Training > Getting Started
- Diversion: 4/7 Workshop > Next Steps
- Survey from Will Connelly, MDHI Executive Director
 - Regional cooperation and coordination are critical, AND change is hard
 - Improvement is needed in data collection and performance measures, especially related to shelter provision
 - Not a clear understanding of current accomplishments or potential accomplishments with shifting investments/programmatic changes
 - Lack of clarity around provider accountability outcomes
 - People and organizations have the right skills to accomplish these things

Releases of Information

- Currently ~1,250 active ROIs of 5,900 total clients in the system
- 75-90 Releases expire every month
- Current ROI expires after 1 year, outdated information listed
- Eventually merge with a single ROI in new HMIS system
- Missing releases – we cannot ID those clients!

PROPOSAL:

Language for 3 year ROI for purposes of housing.

Individual VI-SPDAT v2.0

- We are currently on VI-SPDAT v1.0
- Any new database requires v2.0
- v2.0 is more trauma-informed
- General v2.0 is shorter (27Q) versus MDHI v1.0 (52Q)
- Transitions between TAY-VI-SPDATs & F-VI-SPDATs go with v2.0
- Based on current v1.0 scores, no reduction of interventions with conversion
